

Thom Currie (Artistic Director) is a director, playwright, dramaturg, actor and producer and is currently Artistic Director of Magnus Theatre. Thom has worked in theatres across Canada, including Victoria

Playhouse Petrolia, Sudbury Theatre Centre, Royal Manitoba Theatre Centre, Stage West (Calgary and Mississauga), Theatre In The Park, The Georgian Theatre Festival, The Showboat Festival Theatre and Magnus Theatre, among many others. He has directed and performed in cities such as Paris, London, Amsterdam, Frankfurt and Brussels. Thom has served as Artistic Director at several professional theatres across Canada. Prior to Magnus Theatre, Thom was Artistic Director of the Stephenville Theatre Festival (NL), Managing Artistic Director at The Showboat Festival Theatre In The Round (ON), Artistic Director of The Georgian Theatre Festival (ON) and Founding Artistic Director of ReallyLittleTheatre (INTL). In addition to writing the jukebox musicals Back In 59, Mama's Country Record Collection and POP! Goes The Sixties, Thom has written 15 musicals for young audiences, which have been performed across North America and Europe. His rock opera for young audiences, Rock 'N' Fables, has the distinction of having the most in-school performances of any musical in Canadian Theatre history. Thom is the recipient of the Over The Fence Award from Vision TV for his television adaptation of his play, *The Wish*. Thom has lectured at University of Toronto, Seneca College and Ryerson University, and has worked as an adjudicator, educator and workshop leader across Canada.



Andrew Cecon (Pastor Greg) spent most of his adult life performing in theatres across Western Canada, before returning to Thunder Bay a few years ago. He has appeared at Magnus Theatre in *Miracle on* 

34th Street, Bang Bang, and A Closer Walk With Patsy Cline and Lunenburg. He was most recently seen in Three Musketeers at the Royal Manitoba Theatre Centre. Love to Katrina, Aviva and Joren.



Carly Martin (Jessica/Jolene) is a multi-disciplinary artist and classically trained vocalist from Thunder Bay, ON.She discovered a passion for performing at a young age when she attempted to stage

a neighbourhood production of High School Musical and the rest, as they say, is history. Carly is a recent graduate of Sheridan College's Honours Bachelor of Music Theatre Performance program. She is grateful and ecstatic to be returning to Magnus Theatre to join the hilariously magnificent cast of Hand to God.

maybe through his days as a young dancing Cossack in Chaban Ukrainian Dance Group or his roles in St Patrick High School shows like The Wizard of Oz and The Little Mermaid – wielding a trident no less – he began a career in community theatre as the baker in *Into the Woods* (Paramount Live). Over the years, he went on to perform in Greased, Mamma Mia, and The Addams Family (Badanai Theatre Co), Spring Awakening (Applauze Productions), and Alice in Wonderland (Cambrian Players). Hudson also had the chance to play some truly fun and quirky parts during Thunder Bay's annual 10 x 10 Short Play Festival, including a cowboy in A Man Dies by the Gun and a housecat-turned-human in Benny and Max. Turns out, inhabiting a character is consuming in the best sort of way, and Hudson can't get enough. He is just tickled to be joining the wonderful and hilarious cast of Hand to God and making his Magnus Theatre debut.

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

at the Thunder Bay Community Auditorium setting up some of the biggest shows to come to Thunder Bay.






experience working in film, but this is her first

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
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
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

Magnus Theatre is thrilled to announce The Next Stage project! Magnus Theatre has thrived in its first 50 years as Northern Ontario's only professional theatre. Demand is growing exponentially for both programming and facility rentals, but upgrades are vital to extending possibilities within the community. The Next Stage is a major infrastructure project launched to restore, upgrade, and expand this unique facility to meet emerging needs of the community and to maximize Magnus Theatre's impact as a cultural and economic force.

The project will see the addition of a 125-seat Studio Theatre, expansion of the Production Shop, renovations to the Lounge, and building improvements and retrot, all while maintaining the Heritage features of the Central School building.

The Next Stage project is funded in part by the Government of Canada, FedNor, the Northern Ontario Heritage Fund Corporation, the Trillium Community Building Fund, the Trillium Resilient Communities Fund, the Thunder Bay CEDC, and TBXI.
