Synopsis: Win lives on the rez and Roe lives in the city, where she fled after a terrible family tragedy. After years apart, the two cousins reunite in a back alley in the city to recreate a ceremony from their childhood, but can they remember how? Has the world changed too much? Have they changed too much to reconnect? Alternately heartwarming and heart wrenching, *Two Indians* explores challenges faced by First Nations people across Turtle Island with humour and deep affection.

Please note that **Two Indians** is rooted in Indigenous culture and written for artists who identify as Indigenous.

Roles to be cast:

Winnie (Win). Female Identifying. Lives on the rez, living an uncomplicated life among her family and friends. Uncomfortable in the city, she is here to reunite with Roe and hopes to bring her cousin home. Quick to laugh at society's hypocrisy.

Rose (Roe): Female Identifying. Lives a lonely life and works in retail in the city. Roe left the rez in order to distance herself from a family tragedy. While she misses family, she is uncomfortable with the thought of returning to the rez. Quick to anger at society's hypocrisy.
