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Gabi Epstein (The Girl) is overjoyed to be returning to Magnus Theatre in the thrilling Canadian Premiere of this exciting musical. Hailed "Canada's Queen of Cabaret" by CTV, Gabi is a DORA award winner and one of

Canada's leading stage/cabaret performers best known for playing Audrey in *Little Shop of Horrors* at the Stratford Festival and Fanny Brice in *Funny Girl* at the Segal Centre and in concert for the Harold Green Jewish Theatre. Thunder Bay audiences will remember Gabi rocking out as the Killer Queen in Magnus Theatre's 2017 production of *We Will Rock You*.

Recently, Gabi performed the role of Countess Charlotte in *A Little Night Music* at Koerner Hall in Toronto opposite "Will and Grace" star Eric McCormack.

Othertheatrical credits include: *Rock of Ages* (Elgin Theatre), *Billy Elliott, House of Martin Guerre-In Concert* (Stratford Festival), *Once* (Mirvish-DORA AWARD Best Ensemble/Musical), The Beggar Woman in *Sweeney Todd* (TIFT - DORA AWARD Best Musical), Roz in *9 to 5 The Musical*, (Capitol Theatre) *Prom Queen* (Segal Centre), *Fam Jam* - (Porchside Songs - with her brother Jake Epstein, Musical Stage co.), *Fiddler on the Roof* (Capitol Theatre/Stage West), Yitzhak in *Hedwig and the Angry Inch*, Paquette/Old Lady Candide (TIFT), *The Sound of Music, Blood Brothers, Perfect Wedding* (Drayton), and *To Life* (Harold Green Jewish Theatre- DORA AWARD Nomination Outstanding Performance).

Gabi has performed in countless concerts/cabarets all over North America in such acclaimed venues as The Sony Centre, The Jane Mallett Theatre, Roy Thompson Hall, The Jazz Bistro, Revival Bar, Buddies and Bad Times, The Old Mill, and Don't

Tell Mama in NYC where her solo show was named "Best Cabaret of the Year" by the Times Square Chronicles.

She released her sophomore studio album and love letter to Barbra Streisand, "Gabs Sings Babs" in 2022 which is available on vinyl, CD, Bandcamp, and all digital streaming platforms (as well here in the lobby after the show!).


Her one-woman show also called *Gabs Sings Babs* debuted at the Toronto Jazz Festival and has been subsequently performed at the Segal Centre, Globus Theatre, the Port Stanley Festival Theatre, Theatre Collingwood, the Winnipeg Jewish Theatre, and play at the Capitol Theatre in Port Hope this summer.

Andrew Lloyd Webber (Composer) has composed the scores of some of the world's most famous musicals. From *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat* (1969) to *Cinderella* (2021), his work has

been consistently seen on world stages. Before the COVID pandemic hit, Lloyd Webber had shows continually running in the West End for 48 years and on Broadway for 41. When *Sunset Boulevard* joined *School Of Rock, CATS* and *The Phantom Of the Opera*, he equalled Rodgers & Hammerstein's record of four shows running simultaneously on Broadway. He is one of the select group of artists with EGOT status, having received Emmy, Grammy, Oscar and Tony Awards.

Lloyd Webber owns seven London theatres, including the iconic London Palladium and Theatre Royal, Drury Lane. Over the past three years the latter has been completely restored and renovated at a cost of over £60 million. It is one of the biggest projects ever undertaken by a private theatre owner in recent times. His mantra that every penny of profit made from his theatres is ploughed back into the buildings has meant that considerable work has been undertaken across his theatre portfolio during the pandemic, including the complete remodelling and reseating of the Gillian Lynne.

Lloyd Webber is passionate about the importance of musical education and diversity in the arts. The Andrew Lloyd Webber Foundation provides 30 performing arts scholarships every year for talented students with financial need and supports a range of projects such as the Music In Secondary School Trust and commissioning research into diversity in theatre.


Andrew Lloyd Webber was knighted in 1992 and created an honorary life peer in 1997. To mark his

70th birthday, his bestselling autobiography Unmasked was published by Harper Collins in March 2018.



Don Black (Lyrics) received two Tony Awards for best book and lyrics of a musical for his work (with Christopher Hampton) on Sunset Boulevard, which marked his third collaboration with Andrew Lloyd Webber.

They first joined forces to write the song cycle Tell Me On A Sunday which developed to form the basis of the stage show Song and Dance. They were reunited again for Aspects of Love. He also wrote the lyrics for the Andrew Lloyd Webber-produced Bombay Dreams. Awards include an Oscar for his song "Born Free," five Academy Award nominations, two Tony Awards and three Tony nominations, six Ivor Novello Awards, a Golden Globe and many platinum and gold discs. He has written a quintet of James Bond theme songs: "Thunderball," "Diamonds Are Forever," "The Man With The Golden Gun," "Surrender" from Tomorrow Never Dies and "The World Is Not Enough." Among his many popular songs are two U.S. number ones, "Ben" for Michael Jackson and "To Sir With Love" for Lulu. He was inducted in the Songwriters Hall of Fame in 2008 and recently honoured in London with a BMI Icon award. Don also received the Order of the British Empire in the Queen's honours list. Don's musical, Mrs Henderson Presents, opened in Toronto in March 2017. Don is also a regular broadcaster and has his own show on Radio Two.





Thom Currie (Director) is a director, playwright, dramaturg, actor and producer who has worked in theatres across Canada and Europe and is currently Artistic Director of Magnus Theatre in Thunder Bay.

Prior to Magnus, Thom was Artistic Director of the Stephenville Theatre Festival (NL), Managing Artistic Director at The Showboat Festival Theatre In The Round (ON), Artistic Director of The Georgian Theatre Festival (ON) and Founding Artistic Director of Really Little Theatre (INTL). Thom has directed over 100 productions in his career, in spaces ranging from arenas in Regina to third floor walk-up apartments in Paris.



Paul Rodermond (Musical Director/ Keyboard) is returning to his roots here at Magnus, his first music directing job was with Thom back in Stephenville. That was 2016 when he performed with Amy Sellors in *A*

Closer Walk with Patsy Cline. Since then, he's moved west and currently lives between Winnipeg and Thunder Bay. If you ever made the trip, you might have seen him in the Rainbow Stage pit last summer (Little Mermaid, Rent), or at the Winnipeg Fringe playing The Last Five Years. Some other favourite productions include Fame (Winnipeg Studio Theatre), White Christmas and, A Year with Frog and Toad (Shaw), and Dirty Rotten Scoundrels (STF). Here in town, you might spot him in his finest tux as Principal Keyboard of the TBSO.

a wee dora nomination for best production of *Into the Woods*, and *Pippin*! He has done extensive accessibility advancement with Augmented Reality Immersive Subtitling for live theatre. They are a term adjunct professor of scenography and design at Queen's University, living with their husband and dog, not sure which is the rescue, in Eastern Ontario on the island speckled shores of the Kaniatarowanenneh / St Lawrence River. Skyler James (Projection Design) is an up and coming scenographer based in the Greater Toronto Area and Kingston, the traditional territories of the Mississaugas of the Credit, the Chippewa, the Anishnabeg, the

Haudenosaunee, and the Wendat. Specializing in projection and sound design for theatre and installation art, they are currently exploring how the precarious and profuse relationship between technology, live performance, and the surrounding environment affects audiences. Studying Media and Performance Production at Queen's University, Skyler also dabbles in radio and film production. Selected theatrical credits: **She's Not Special** (Tarragon Theatre), **The Rocky Horror Picture Show** (St. Lawrence College), **The Last Night at the Cabaret Solitaire & The Pirates of Penzance** (Queen's University and the Dan School of Drama and Music). 
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Jeremy Lapalme (Assistant Director) made his professional directorial debut on another musical starring the incorrigible Gabi Epstein, *Gabs Sings Babs* which most recently had a sold out run at the Winnipeg Jewish

Theatre. As a performer Jeremy spent most of last year playing the villainous Mayor of L.A. in the DORA Award nominated Rock of Ages. He also has worked extensively with Stage West Calgary, most recently as the perennial 'good man', Charlie Brown. For Magnus Theatre: the hippie stoner guru Buddy in We Will Rock You and the faithful, beleaguered servant Sancho Panza in Man of La Mancha. Jeremy is also a writer having just launchedtheawardwinningcomedicvideogame "Lil' Guardsman" with Hilltop Studios (now available on Steam and all consoles) and creating new comedic works with his dear friends at Bain and Bernard Comedy specializing in vaudeville, parodying Shakespeaare and general silliness. They include A Midsummers Nightmare (or How I Learned To Stop Worrying And Love Desdemona Anyway), Sherlock Holmes and the Case of Hamlet, and Romeo and Juliet: Chainsaw Massacre which was selected as Best of Fringe in the Toronto Fringe Festival 2016.. Jeremy is a proud graduate of both the performing arts program at Wexford School of the Arts and Sheridan College's prestigious Musical Theatre Performance program.

Andrew Bell (Drums) is percussionist based out of Thunder Bay, Ontario, where he performs as a member of the Thunder Bay Symphony Orchestra. Andrew studiedattheUniversityofTorontoand

the Glenn Gould School of the Royal Conservatory of Music under the guidance of Aiyun Huang and Charles Settle. Andrew has been fortunate to have performed under the baton of many esteemed conductors, including Andrei Feher, Tania Miller, Johannes Debus, Michael Francis, and Peter Oundjian. Andrew's musical interests expand beyond the scope of orchestral music, as a member of the Technology and Performance Integration Research Lab he has actively explored creating and performing music which utilizes the cutting edge tools to create a new avenue for classical music. This culminated in the creation of the Aux-Cord Etudes, a series of pieces for auxiliary percussion and electronics, designed to teach students both the skills necessary to perform with live electronics, and how to increase technical facility on cymbals, tambourine, triangle and bass drum. Andrew was supported in this research by the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada and presented it at musical conferences. When not performing, Andrew can often be found cooking, or in the mosh pit of a local metal concert.



Heather Morrison (Alternate Keyb oard) held the position of Principal Keyboard with the Thunder Bay Symphony Orchestra for over four decades, and was a lecturer in Lakehead University's Department of

Music for even longer! She maintains the position of Concert Co-ordinator and Faculty Pianist for Interprovincial Music Cam held annually in the Muskokas. Chambermusichasalwaysbeencentral to her life and she has enjoyed many collaborations


the great community at Magnus Theatre. When


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












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
