
Sophia Fabiilli (Playwright) is a playwright, actor, director, and educator. As an award-winning playwright, her works include: *The Philanderess* (The Second City Award for Best New Comedy, 2015),

Liars at a Funeral (Ellen Ross Stuart Opening Doors Award, 2018), and her newest project, Why It's Impossible to Raise a Girl. Recently, she directed Every Brilliant Thing at the Thousand Islands Playhouse (2022) where she served as the Associate Artistic Director for three seasons. She's also a graduate of the Bell Media Prime Time TV Writing Program at the Canadian Film Centre and completed her Bachelor of Education at Queen's University.



Thom Currie (Director) is a director, playwright, dramaturg, actor and producer who has worked in theatres across Canada and Europe and is currently Artistic Director of Magnus Theatre in Thunder Bay.

Prior to Magnus, Thom was Artistic Director of the Stephenville Theatre Festival (NL), Managing Artistic Director at The Showboat Festival Theatre In The Round (ON), Artistic Director of The Georgian Theatre Festival (ON) and Founding Artistic Director of Really Little Theatre (INTL). Thom has directed over 100 productions in his career, in spaces ranging from arenas in Regina to third floor walk-up apartments in Paris.





Richard Comeau (Quint/Cam) is an actor, fight director, and is proud to be the first Indigenous person to become a Certified Fight Instructor with Fight Directors Canada. He is beyond thrilled to be making his Magnus debut



Sweeney MacArthur (Wayne/Frank) has been in some shows and this is another one! Thanks to Magnus for having me back. Love this town, love this theatre!





He designed the lighting for WJT's Narrow Bridge and Sick and Twisted's Antigone. Other productions include designing scenery and lighting for UW's Stupid Fucking Bird, lighting for UW's The Drowning Girls. 





MEET THE MUSICIAN KATHERINE NEMEC





Magnus Theatre is thrilled to announce The Next Stage project!

Magnus Theatre has thrived in its first 50 years as Northwestern Ontario's only professional theatre. Demand is growing exponentially for both programming and facility rentals, but upgrades are vital to extending possibilities within the community. The Next Stage is a major infrastructure project launched to restore, upgrade, and expand this unique facility to meet emerging needs of the community and to maximize Magnus Theatre's impact as a cultural and economic force.

The project will see the addition of a 125-seat Studio Theatre, expansion of the Production Shop, renovations to the Lounge, and building improvements and retrofit, all while maintaining the Heritage features of the Central School building.
