productions have been staged throughout Canada and internationally, including in the United States, United Kingdom, Poland, Australia, and New Zealand. His plays include Stag and Doe, Bed and Breakfast, The Birds and the Bees, Boys, Girls, and Other Mythological Creatures, The New Canadian Curling Club, Chase the Ace, The Gig, and The Golden Anniversaries. His latest work, Ruby and the Reindeer, is set to debut in December 2025. Mark has received nominations for the Playwrights Guild of Canada Comedy Award and the Stephen Leacock Medal for Humour, and Scirocco Drama publishes his plays. Beyond writing, Mark has built an extensive acting career, performing on stages nationwide. He trained in theatre at the University of Toronto and Sheridan College, and currently resides in Stratford with his partner Paul.



#### FEATURING, THOM CURRIE

Thom Currie is an award-winning director, playwright, dramaturg, actor and producer. Thom has worked in theatres across Canada such as Victoria Playhouse Petrolia, Sudbury Theatre Centre, Royal Manitoba Theatre Centre, Stage West (Calgary and Mississauga), Theatre In The Park, Georgian Theatre Festival, Showboat Festival Theatre In The

Round and Magnus Theatre, among many others. His work has also been seen internationally, having directed and performed in cities such as Paris, London, Amsterdam, Frankfurt and Brussels. His directing and dramaturgy credits include over 100 productions, in addition to over 50 productions for young audiences.

As an actor, some of Thom's favourite roles have included appearances in productions of The Foursome, Perfect Wedding, Dirty Rotten Scoundrels, Come Blow Your Horn, The Glass Menagerie, Lawrence And Holloman, Storm Warning and The Love List. Thom last appeared onstage at Magnus Theatre in Jacob Marley's Christmas Carol in 2022.

Thom has served as Artistic Director at several professional theatres across Canada. He is currently Artistic Director of Magnus Theatre in Thunder Bay, ON, the only professional theatre between Barrie and Winnipeg. Previous to this, Thom was Artistic Director of the Stephenville Theatre Festival (NL), Managing Artistic Director at The Showboat Festival Theatre In The Round (ON), Artistic Director of The Georgian Theatre Festival (ON) and Founding Artistic Director of ReallyLittleTheatre (INTL).

In addition to writing the jukebox musicals Back In 59, Mama's Country Record Collection and POP! Goes The Sixties, Thom has written 15 musicals for young audiences, which have been performed across North America and Europe. His rock opera for young audiences, Rock 'N' Fables, has the distinction of having the most in-school performances of any musical in Canadian Theatre history. Thom is the recipient of the Vision TV Over The Fence Award for his television adaptation of his play, The Wish.

Thom has also lectured at University of Toronto, Seneca College and Toronto Metropolitan University (formerly Ryerson University), and has worked as an adjudicator, educator and workshop leader across Canada.




REBECCA MILLER (Production Manager & Lighting Designer)

include production design on Peter Pan, A Bench In The Sun (Georgian Theatre), set design A Closer Walk With Patsy Cline and Blue Champagne (Stephenville Theatre Festival), Last of the Red Hot Lovers, Back In 59, Mama's Country Record Collection (Showboat Festival) and Urinetown (Theatre Aurora). Warden lives in Owen Sound and does his best to speak only in French at home. He is very happy to work with Thom and Magnus Theatre again. Warden feels they have come a long way since Kleines verlorenes Kaninchen and El espantapájaros sentimental in the early 90s.



#### THE NEXT STAGE PROJECT CONTINUES!

Magnus Theatre has thrived as Northwestern Ontario's only professional theatre since 1971. With increased demand for programming and arts spaces, Magnus Theatre continues its' mission to enhance arts possibilities within our community.

The Next Stage Project began to restore, upgrade, and expand the Magnus Theatre facility to meet the emerging needs of the community. So far, the project has seen the addition of a brand-new Studio Theatre, expansion and upgrade of all production facilities, an overhaul of the building HVAC systems, all-new public washrooms, lounge, and iyouth classrooms, all done while carefully maintaining and respecting the heritage features of the Historic Central School. The project continues, as we endeavour to make our heritage building greener and energy efficient, with plans to replace windows, improve the parking lot, convert stage lighting to environmentally friend LED fixtures and upgrade all hearing-assist systems.

The Next Stage Project has been funded in part by the Government of Canada, FedNor, the Northern Ontario Heritage Fund Corporation, the Trillium Community Building Fund, the Trillium Resilient Communities Fund, TBXI and the Thunder Bay CEDC. The project continues to be supported by many private donors and sponsors who believe strongly that professional arts are an integral part of a strong and healthy community.


