

ABOUT THE PLAYWRIGHT

Andrew Lloyd Webber (Music)



Andrew Lloyd Webber stands among the most celebrated composers in the history of musical theatre. His works have graced London's West End continuously for half a century, with a Broadway presence spanning 43 years. At one point, he matched the legendary Rodgers & Hammerstein by having four productions running on Broadway at the same time — *The Phantom of the Opera*, *CATS*, *School of Rock*, and *Sunset Boulevard*.

A proud member of the rare EGOT circle, Lloyd Webber holds Emmy, Grammy, Oscar, and Tony Awards among his many accolades. He is also the steward of six London theatres, among them the storied London Palladium and Theatre Royal Drury Lane — the latter of which underwent a sweeping private restoration exceeding £60 million when it reopened in 2021. True to his philosophy, every dollar of profit generated by his venues flows directly back into preserving and enriching those historic spaces.

Lloyd Webber's commitment to arts education and inclusivity runs deep. Through the Andrew Lloyd Webber Foundation, 30 performing arts scholarships are awarded annually to financially deserving students, and vital initiatives like the Music In Secondary Schools Trust (MiSST) receive ongoing support. In the 2025–26 academic year alone, nearly 15,000 children are receiving free instruments and music instruction through MiSST's Andrew Lloyd Webber Programme.


His reach extends to landmark global occasions as well — he was commissioned to compose *Make a Joyful Noise*, the official anthem for the Coronation of King Charles III. Lloyd Webber was knighted in 1992, elevated to the House of Lords as a life peer in 1997, and in 2024 became the first and only person from the arts to be appointed a Knight Companion of the Most Noble Order of the Garter — a personal honour bestowed by King Charles III himself.

ABOUT THE PLAYWRIGHT

TIM RICE

(Lyrics)

Tim Rice's career in music, theatre, and film began in 1965 with a chance meeting — a fellow aspiring songwriter named Andrew Lloyd Webber. Setting aside Tim's dreams of writing rock and pop hits, the two turned their focus toward Andrew's true passion: musical theatre.



Their first effort was a stage piece based on the life of Victorian philanthropist Dr. Thomas Barnardo, called *The Likes of Us*. What followed were three landmark works that would reshape the musical theatre landscape: *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat*, *Jesus Christ Superstar*, and *Evita*.

Since parting creative paths with Lloyd Webber, Rice has collaborated with an extraordinary roster of composers. With Elton John he crafted *The Lion King* and *Aida*; with Alan Menken, *Aladdin*, *Beauty and the Beast*, and *King David*; and with ABBA's Björn Ulvaeus and Benny Andersson, the celebrated musical *Chess*. His pen has also found its way into projects alongside Freddie Mercury, Burt Bacharach, Rick Wakeman, and Stuart Brayson (*From Here to Eternity*), among others.

Off stage, Rice is a devoted cricket enthusiast. He founded his own cricket team in 1973 — a side that has now played more than 750 matches — and served as president of the MCC, founded in 1789, in 2002.

A familiar and knowledgeable voice across various media, he draws frequently on his deep expertise in the history of popular music. Rice holds EGOT status, placing him among only 17 people worldwide to have earned Emmy, Grammy, Oscar, and Tony Awards. He was knighted by HM Queen Elizabeth II in 1994.

At home, he is the contented keeper of a boxer dog and two dozen chickens.





KSENIA BRODA-MILIAN


(Set Designer)




DAVID A. BROWN






